






Vulnerable Recipient Households (reported by States)


Households with
Older Adult Member




Households with

Types of Assistance (reported by States)

Heating Assistance was provided by 51 states and served 5,028,871 households with estimated average benefits of \$380.

Cooling Assistance was provided by 23 states and served 751,119 households with estimated average benefits of \$583.

Year-round Crisis Assistance was provided by 29 states and served 626,391 households with estimated average benefits of \$673.

Winter Crisis Assistance was provided by 23 states and served 690,348 households with estimated average benefits of \$464.

Summer Crisis Assistance was provided by 5 states and served 105,506 households with estimated average benefits of \$251.

Weatherization Assistance was provided by 47 states and served 49,793 households.

*Grant recipients may set income-eligibility between 110% of Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG) and the greater of 150% FPG or 60% of State Median Income (whichever is greater).

One state (HI) is excluded from the total funding obligation amounts due to reporting challenges. Excludes Tribal and Territory Grant Recipients; Data are current as of May 30, 2025.
